



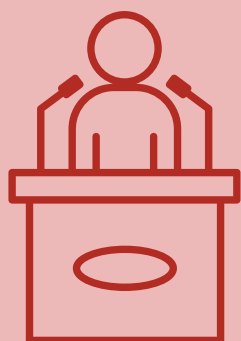

What is the Delegates' Assembly?



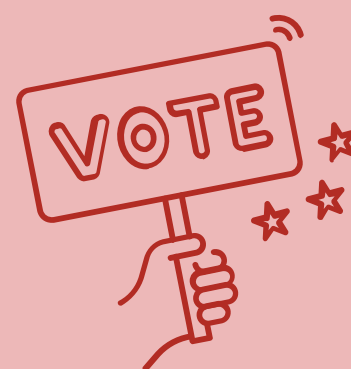
One of the most important bodies of the Students' Union is the Delegates' Assembly, which is actually the organization's law-making body. The Delegates' Assembly is the body that, on behalf of the students, decides on the most important matters of the SU, such as rules, officials and the operation of the Students' Union.

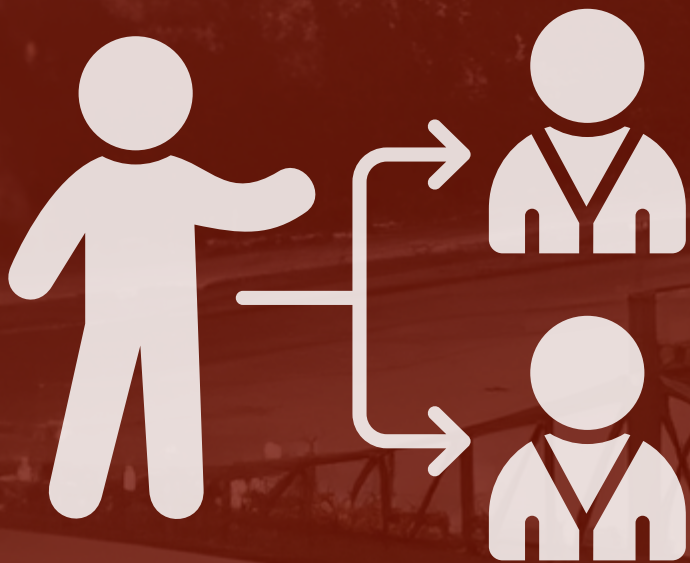


In short, the members of the DA are the ones who represent the students in the coming period, and they are the ones who have a say in the university's rule-making

Who can elect?



All students with an active student status can participate in the election. **Voting is equal, secret and direct.**

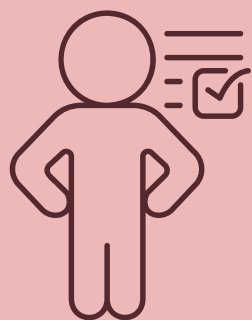


Any student who submits a valid application during the nomination period can run as a candidate.

What kinds of votes are there?



You can vote:



1. for individual candidates



2. for a group of representatives / list

The system uses two electoral districts:

- bachelor's district
- master's district

Number of mandates



15 individual mandates

10 mandates in the bachelor's district,
5 mandates in the master's district



26 list mandates



How to make a list?



A group of representatives can set up a list if:



- It has at least 10 and no more than 50 students,
- At least 3 majors are represented,
- And at least 3 years appear on the list.

How can you vote?



The election is conducted electronically through the University's Moodle system, anonymously.



The results of the election are determined by the Supervisory Board and must be published. If there is a legal remedy, it will be reviewed by the SU Presidency. If there is no further remedy, the result becomes final. The newly elected Delegates' Assembly must then be convened within 15 days.

The election does not end at the end of the vote, but when the elected body actually stands up and begins its work.

For a valid application, the candidate must submit the following documents:

- **a document containing his/her name, year, major, motivation letter, and photograph (election poster),**
- **a document officially certifying his/her active (non-suspended) student status,**
- **a declaration stating that:**
 - **he/she is familiar with and accepts the provisions of the Statutes;**
 - **if he/she wishes to run as an individual candidate, a declaration of this;**
 - **in which electoral district he/she is running;**
 - **his/her consent to the publication of the listed data during the election period.**

EXACT DATES



- April 2, 2026, 0:00 – April 17, 2026, 23:59 – nomination period
- April 18, 2026, 0:00 – April 20, 2026, 23:59 – nomination review period
- April 21, 2026, 0:00 – April 23, 2026, 23:59 – nomination legal remedy period
- April 24, 2026, 0:00 – April 26, 2026, 23:59 – review period following nomination legal remedy period
- April 27, 2026, 0:00 – May 10, 2026, 23:59 – voting period
- May 11, 2026, 0:00 – May 11, 2026, 23:59 – result determination period
- May 12, 2026, 0:00 – May 14, 2026, 23:59 – legal remedy period for voting results
- May 15, 2026, 0:00 – May 16, 2026, 23:59 – review period following the legal remedy period for voting.
